SATIRE / HOAX <i>intended as humor/fun</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">social commentary or humorvaries widely in quality; intended meaning may not be apparentcan be embarrassing if people believe it as true	LOWER IMPACT
ERROR <i>intended to (mis)inform</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">legitimate news organizations sometimes make mistakesmistakes can be harmful or result in litigationreputable organizations publish apologies	
PARTISAN <i>motivated by passion or politics/power</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">interprets facts while claiming to be impartialselects facts that fit with their view, while avoiding other viewpointsuses emotional and passionate language	MEDIUM
CONSPIRACY THEORY <i>powered by passion, intended to (mis)inform</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">rejects experts and authorityuses fear and uncertainty to explain realitieslack of evidence that refutes the conspiracy is used to "prove" the conspiracy	HIGHEST IMPACT
PSEUDOSCIENCE <i>motivated by money or politics/power</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">misrepresents real scientific studies with exaggerated or false claimsoften contradicts expertsexamples: miracle cures, anti-vaccination	HIGHEST LEVELS OF HARMFUL IMPACT
MISINFORMATION <i>intended to (mis)inform</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">mix of factual, false, or partly-false contentauthor may not be aware the content is falsefalse attributions, doctored content, and misleading headlines	HIGHEST LEVELS OF HARMFUL IMPACT
BOGUS / FAKE <i>motivated by political influence or ad revenue</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">entirely fabricated content spread intentionally to disinformguerrilla marketing tactics; bots, comments, and counterfeit branding	HIGHEST LEVELS OF HARMFUL IMPACT
