MINUTES OF THE MNI BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING, September 25, 2019 MNA Offices, Minneapolis

The meeting was called to order at 3:30 p.m. by President Justin Lessman. The minutes from the May 2019, June 27 and Sept 10 (email vote) meetings were approved on a **motion** by Dalton, seconded by Brandl.

President Lessman and Hills noted that the call vote was to approve Doug Hanneman to replace Jim Pumarlo on the board.

Financial review was given by Evans.

Hills reported the Blandin Grant application has been submitted. Should find out result of grant in December.

MNA Convention Fundraising. Yattaw reported that Student reception and 'Meet the Publisher' is moving forward. A speaker (Luke Howl) has been obtained and Phil Siebel is working on getting sponsorship money. This will be held approximately 430 – 530p on January 30, prior to the BNC reception.

Lessman will again be our auctioneer at the BNC live auction, raising money for the Intern program. Koenen/Yattaw suggested using a TIPBOARD for fundraising in place of the raffle this year. Yattaw is speaking to MN Gambling Permits/rules to see legality of running the TIPBOARD. No decision was made on prize money at this time until more information is obtained.

Motion to use TIPBOARD in place of raffle by Koenen, seconded by Brandl.

Silent Auction – ask all board members to donate.

Yattaw reported Lanyard sponsorship was sold, as well as 4 trade show booth at this time.

Hills/Yattaw reported the completion of the pilot year (2019) for the Summer Intern Program. There were 10 interns, Hills shared comments given by the interns. Total hours worked by interns – 1805, also represented were 5 from colleges and 5 from high-schools.

2020 Internship Program was discussion on fairness of selection of newspaper, overall everyone felt to keep the selection as is.

Motion was made by Dalton, seconded by Ramige to continue program for the next 2 years as part of a three-year test/pilot to determine ability of financially sustaining the program long term. Number of internship available for 2020 to be determined at December meeting, with a minimum of 10.

Hills reported that the E & P program had a great year with good cohorts.

MNI training programs; Hills/Yattaw reported that the Beginning Sales program on 10/11 has several signed up – to be held in Burnsville. The Circulation roundtable program will be held in St. Cloud 10/23. No additional programming scheduled for remainder of 2019.

Drew suggested having a New Journalist program in early June (2020). This would be a great timing to include the Summer Interns. No discussion on who should lead that session.

No other business at this time.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:28 p.m. on a motion by Dalton, seconded by Koenen
